From the Rabbi's Study



Counting the Days

Beginning on the second night of Passover we count the Days of the Omer. An Omer is a biblical dry measure, somewhat smaller than a bushel. The Torah prescribes the practice of setting aside this measure of the new barley harvest, which would happen close to the time of Passover, and then counting each of the 49 days between Passover and the Holy Day of Shavuot, which commemorates the day when the People of Israel received the "Ten Statements of Commandments" at Mt. Sinai. Then that Omer of grain would be brought as an offering to the Holy Temple.

This counting of the Days between Passover and Shavuot constitutes a mental chain connecting them to each other. It creates a message telling us that the purpose of the freedom that Passover represents is to enable humanity to create a civilization that embodies the values of the teachings of the Torah.

May our observance of the Holy season of Passover and Shavuot inspire us to dedicate our energies towards increasing human dignity, freedom and happiness in the world.

Khag Sahmayakh, Happy Festivals to all.

KOSHER CREATIONS

We hope you will enjoy trying out these tasty treats each month. Bonnie Goldstein will be collecting and compiling the recipes for the newsletter. Our first two recipes are for Passover:

Apple Cake

(Gluten, Grain, Sugar and Dairy Free)

From: Bonnie Goldstein

Serves 8

Ingredients

4 eggs

½ c honey

½ c coconut oil (melted) (I use avocado oil)

1 C peeled, and diced apple pieces

3 C blanched almond flour

½ tsp salt

½ tsp. baking soda

Preheat oven to 350°

Broccoli/Carrot Passover Muffins

From: Bonnie Goldstein

1 onion (sautéed in a little oil)

4 carrots (peeled and grated)

2 pkgs. Chopped Broccoli (frozen)

½ c Matzo Meal

4 eggs

1 tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

Cook and drain broccoli
Add other ingredients
Put in greased muffin tins

Bake at 350° for 40-45 minutes

Prepare your baking pan

Line a 6"-8" round springform pan with parchment paper on the base, trim the excess.

Close the springform pan and butter the sides and the parchment covered base (I used Passover olive oil spray) Set aside.

Prepare the apple pieces

Peel, quarter, and deseed a sweet crisp apple (honey crisp suggested).

Slice into ¼" inch slices.

Halve each slice and then cut into pieces (this way your pieces are square and not rectangular).

Whisk the eggs, honey and oil.

Mix the apple pieces into the whisked, wet ingredients.

In a separate bowl, mix the blanched almond flour, salt and baking soda.

Mix the wet and dry ingredients together. Blend well.

Pour into the prepared springform pan.

Bake around 45 minutes, maybe longer, but watch for too much browning.

Remove from the oven and let cool 30 minutes to an hour.

Don't worry if your cake sinks in the center, this is a dense and heavy cake.

Slice into triangles and serve.




