MATZOH KUGEL

Ingredients:

¾ c oil

¾ c chopped onions

3 stalks of celery

10 Matzo (broken) or 7 cups matzo farfel

1 tsp salt

1 T paprika

1 egg

3 cans condensed chicken soup

1 C diced fresh mushrooms (I use sliced)

Directions:

- 1. Soak matzo in water and squeeze out water
- 2. Saute onions, celery and mushrooms until brown
- 3. Combine remaining ingredients
- 4. Bake 45 minutes until brown 350°

PASSOVER CHAROSET

2 cups chopped apples
½ cup chopped walnuts
½ tsp cinnamon
2 T Manischewitz wine (I put in a splash extra)
2 T Honey (I use 2 ½ Tablespoons)
Mix together and chill.
