From the Rabbi's Study



We are now counting the "Omer"- the days between Passover and Shavuot. Passover represents the physical freedom of our ancestors from slavery in Egypt. Shavuot represents the spiritual freedom that comes from having a dedication to spiritual, moral, and ethical values.

Seven weeks after leaving Egypt our ancestors arrived at Mt Sinai where they experienced the divine communication of the Ten Statements of Commandments, which amount to the outline for all the teachings of the Torah.

The Torah describes the statements as "Khah root", meaning in Hebrew, engraved on the tablets of stone. The Talmud says, "There is no "KHAY-root" meaning freedom in Hebrew, without "Khah-root", referring to the statements engraved on the stones.

Thus, the sages of the Talmud expressed the profound idea that liberty without guidance and values becomes obscene licentiousness, but with dedication to moral and ethical teachings becomes true meaningful Freedom.

We must be vigilant, and we must let those in Congress know that such language should not be tolerated.

The following recipe was submitted by Linda Baulsir.

ZUCCHINI KISHKA KUGEL

(gluten free)

Double the recipe for a 13" x 9" x 2" pan

Kishka Layer:

- 1 carrot
- 1 potato
- 1 stalk celery
- 1 small onion
- 1/3 cup oil
- 5 Tablespoons potato starch
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1-1/2 tsp. paprika

Peel all vegetables. Put them in a food processor and grate until finely chopped.

Mix the rest of the ingredients with the grated vegetables.

Pour into an 8" x 8" square pan. (For easy unmolding, line an with slightly oiled parchment paper). Or serve directly from baking pan, no need to line pan with oiled parchment paper.

Bake at 350 for 25 minutes.

Zucchini Layer:

- 1 onion
- 2 medium zucchini—do not peel
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 cup potato starch
- 2 Tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- 1/4 tsp. salt or use Tablespoon parve chicken bouillon.

Grate all vegetables in food processor. Add the rest of the ingredients. Pour over baked kishka layer. Bake additional 45 minutes at 350 degrees.

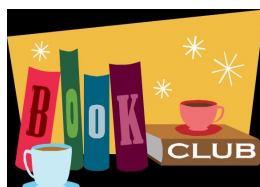

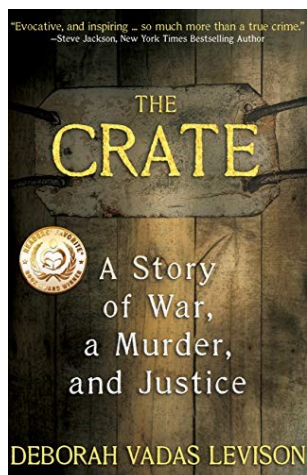

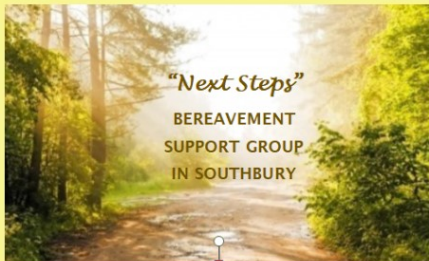
